Manor of Wootton and Boarshill

For Court Baron of Richard Hyde, gentleman, and his wife Elizabeth, of this said manor, held here by John Hallywell, gentleman and steward here, on the eleventh of November in the nineteenth year of the reign of our lady Elizabeth, Queen of England, France and Ireland, Defender of the Faith etc. With the agreement of interested parties and others. Thus, to this court came Henry Woodliffe, son of Thomas Woodliffe of Wootton aforesaid, deceased, and received from the lord of this manor Renicoem and Renines, a messuage and a virgate of arable land with appurtenances, consisting, by estimation, of *fifteen* acres of land, situated in this manor. Wherefore: an acre of land situated in Holmore; a yard in Longfurlong; another piece called a yard lying under Fernell hedge in the said furlong; three pieces called yards situated under *Yolleg* furlong; half an acre of land lying on Cumnor Way; half an acre lying by the same by *Pilinds piece*; a butt/knoll consisting of half an acre in church close; a piece called a yard lying at the edge of the same butt; another half an acre lying on Dead Pitt; another half acre in Middle Furlong; another half acre situated on *Cholswell*; another half acre situated at Blagrove Hedge; another half acre lying on le Well; another half acre abutting Sandford Ford; a piece called a yard lying under Blagrove Hedge; a piece called a yard situated at Whitecross; a half acre situated at Dead Womans Bush; three pieces called yards situated in Overland; a half acre situated at *Foxcome Hill*; a piece called a yard at Dead Womans Bush; half an acre abutting Oxford Way; another half acre in the Bottom at Madgore; another half acre lying under Hanging Land; a piece called a yard at Wellspring; a half acre lying in *Floelande*; another half acre within nether *Hoylland*; another half acre lying in Butter Way; another half acre abutting *Legegend House*; a piece called a yard at *Plaintree*; a half acre lying in Broadrushe next to the Grove; another half acre situated on *Foxcome Hill* in the heath side; another half acre lying at Boarshill lands end; a piece called a yard lying in the heath; a *public piece called an assigned piece of the pound* situated in Madgore; and *the edge* of a close lying by the said messuage and the first half of an acre of meadow in the first sett of Berry Meade called *a cottagers* acre and a yard of meadow in Berry Meade and half of a meadow in *Colswell Lott Meade*. To have and to hold Renicoem and Renines, the said messuage and half a virgate of land with its various appurtenances for the said Henry Woodliffe for the term of his life according to the custom of the said manor, with, a forfeit or surrender by Edith Woodliffe, heir of the said Thomas Woodliffe after his death, rendering thereby annually three shillings and three pence, horses *and pigs* at the usual feast times, and to the court all other services. The inheritance passes (to him) according to the custom of the manor and he acknowledges fealty. ex
