The Homage present They present that Osmund Adkins kept ten cows on the common more than is allowed and against the stated penalty and is thereby amerced six shillings and eight pence

Present They also present that Osmund Adkins , Thomas Woodliffe, William Truelock allowed their pigs to go without rings (English unringed) against the stated penalty, therefore each is fined twelve pence.

Present They also present that John Rede made a public path through the gate of Nicholas Badcock in Whitehill Furlong and is amerced six pence

Penalties	It is ordered that the said Homage shall assemble at Lassford Gate twenty days after the first of May to set the extents and bounds of the community and this is required under pain of twelve pence for each defaulter
penalties	It is also ordered that no tenants of this manor, from twenty days after the first of May shall keep more than fifty (?) sheep on one yardland , under pain for each defaulter of four pence
penalties	It is also ordered that each tenant of this manor shall maintain his part of the ditch between Delronnins Bushes(?) to Blagrove corner field by twenty days after the first of May under pain for each defaulter of thirteen pence
penalties	It is also ordered that each shall maintain his part of the ditch between Whitecross and Richard Howell under pain for each defaulter of three shillings and three pence

Nicholas Badcock      To this court came Nicholas Badcock and received from the lord by his steward a messuage and one virgate of land with appurtenances in the said Boarshill according to the inheritance of land by custom of the manor, previously in the tenure of his father John Badcock, to have and to hold all and singular premises with appurtenances to the said Nicholas Badcock for the term of his life at the will of the lord according to the custom of the said manor at annual rent of sixteen shillings, by all owed customs and services, and a heriot falls due, according to the custom of the manor and by fixed title thus the said heir Nicholas Badcock pays to the lord a fine of thirty pounds, is admitted as tenant and did fealty according to custom.

Nicholas Badcock      To this court came Nicholas Badcock and received from the lord of this Manor by his steward a messuage with one virgate of land with appurtenances, situated in said Boarshill *called Miles* according to the custom of inheritance of land this said manor, previously in the tenure of the said John Badcock, to have and to hold all and singular premises with appurtenances for the said Nicholas Badcock for the term of his life at the will of the lord according to the custom of the said manor, for a rent to his lord of twelve shillings at the usual feast times, and all customs and services thence owed, and a heriot falls due. He gives to the lord a fine of thirty pounds, is admitted as tenant and did fealty to the lord according to custom.
